The primary section follows the curriculum prescribed by the NCERT enriched by an inter-disciplinary thematic approach that incorporates the best practices from different curricula.

The curriculum across the primary saw a major revamp by making Physical Education, Art & Craft and Music as integral components of the curriculum. A wide range of clubs give them opportunities to experience, explore, experiment and embed varieties of concepts, ideas, issues and responses. Following detailed, careful analysis and comparison with other curricula and considering the needs of the students, a change was brought about in the text books being used. We now have a curriculum developed to promote critical thinking, creativity and independent learning.

Curriculum is to be reviewed in subject group meetings periodically and modification to be made, if required.

Benchmarks outlining the expected learning outcomes of the students are prepared in all key subjects.

Teaching, Learning and Assessment

a) Teaching for effective learning

All our teachers have very good knowledge in their subject areas and most have qualification in education. They make use of various resources to enhance their knowledge. The lesson plan template brought out by the DSIB is used to plan lessons effectively. In addition to the lesson plan an IEP (Individual Education Plan) is also used for each SEND student. Challenging study materials are given to the gifted students.

Teachers endeavor to arouse critical thinking and problem solving skills and bring out the creativity in each child.

b) Learning

The lessons are planned with class activities of various types to maximize collaborative learning and interaction between peers and student and teacher. Real life and cross curricular links form an integral part of the curriculum.

c) Assessment

Internal:Assessment:Students' attainment and progress in various subjects and their attitudes, behavior, responses, etc are assessed as per guidelines from CBSE. There are two periodic and two Half yearly tests in a year. Rubrics are used to specifically report on the abilities, inabilities of the students. Written, constructive feedback is given at the end of every assessment.

External Assessment: Our students from grades 3 upwards enroll for the NAP tests - ASSET and CAT 4

D)Personal and Social Development and their innovation skills

An array of curricular and cocurricular activities are conducted regularly to ensure the all round development of our students.

On non assembly days video on expected behavior is played followed by mellifluous calming music or yoga. Teacher also looks out for signs of depression, anxiety or unhappiness in children and reports the same if needed.

During break, the class teacher is present in the class and shares snack time with students thus getting another opportunity to interact with them.
